The Body Remembers When the World Broke Open [Kathleen Hepburn & Elle-Máijá Tailfeathers, Canada/Norway, 2019, levelFILM]
Starring: Violet Nelson, Elle-Máijá Tailfeathers

When Áila (Tailfeathers) encounters Rosie (Nelson) who has just escaped a violent assault at the hands of her boyfriend, Áila decides to bring Rosie home with her. *The Body Remembers When the World Broke Open* weaves an intricately complex, while at the same time very simple story of a chance encounter between two Indigenous women with drastically different lived experience.

The Cuban [Sergio Navarretta, Canada, 2019, A71 Entertainment]
Starring: Louis Gossett Jr., Ana Golja, Shohreh Aghdashloo, Lauren Holly, Giacomo Gianniotti

Luis (Gossett Jr.) is one of Mina's (Golja) most enigmatic patients, he has dementia and Alzheimer's and spends his time in a wheelchair in a quiet corner of his room, retreated inside his own mind. To her surprise, Mina's humming ignites a spark inside him and he begins to awaken. As each day passes, Luis reacts, reminisces, dances, and talks more and more. Through his stories, Luis reveals his colourful past as a famous Cuban musician.

Easy Land [Sanja Zivkovic, Canada, 2019, Mongrel Media] Starring: Mirjana Jokovic, Nina Kiri, Daniel Kash

Jasna (Jokovic) and her daughter Nina (Kiri) are Serbian refugees who have come to Canada to create new lives for themselves. Jasna, a skilled architect, wants to create a better, brighter future for her daughter, but as newcomers to the country, they encounter numerous struggles. Having quit her medication, Jasna's mental illness proves to be a problem as her behaviour becomes manic. Meanwhile, Nina must do her best to endure an extra year of high school.



Struggling to secure work after the controversy surrounding her thesis, Sophia (Bossé) needs to take a hard look at her life choices. She "temporarily" moves in with her older brother Karim (Hivon) to save money. Their close relationship will be put to the test when Karim falls head over heels in love with Sophia's doctor Eloïse (Brochu). This separation, that feels to Sophia like a breakup, is going to force her to question her real purpose in life and make choices that will allow her to finally become an adult.













